

Welcome to Christ Church on this Septuagesima Sunday and a special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the service.

Have you ever thought about evangelism? Have you ever considered how we, as individuals, might go about evangelising? It seems to me that in the Anglican Church we are a bit wary of this subject. So often our only experience of evangelism is when someone approaches us on the street and makes a valiant attempt to convert us to the faith.

Many years ago, Jeannie and I were walking along Rundle Street and a likely lad leapt out from a doorway and asked us if we wanted to go to heaven. I was a truck driver at the time. My response was immediate. "Not at the moment thank you." And we kept walking.

There have also been occasions when I have been accused of being such a sinner that my chances of getting into heaven were non-existent. Salvation was dependent on me believing exactly what that person said. Invariably I disagreed with their understanding of a judgmental God who would happily see me fry for eternity.

Sadly, when we think of evangelism these are the images which come to mind. There is a much more healthy approach to evangelism, and that is for us to be confident in our faith and to speak of our faith clearly and confidently.

It is not for us to judge. It is not for us to punish. Our task in evangelism is to show the great love of God through our actions and our words. As for judgement, we shall leave that to God, for God is much better qualified for this task than us.



HEAR us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood: who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me.

LIKEWISE after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,

Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of Me. \blacksquare

WHEREFORE, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

MOST humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

AND here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and lively sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee, that all we, who are partakers of this holy Communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

AND although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences.

Today's Music

This morning the choir sings John Ireland's (1879-1962) Communion Service in C. Ireland was a talented professional composer, but although he was organist at St Luke's Church, Chelsea, for some twenty-two years, he wrote comparatively little music for the church. This popular Communion Service was written in 1914. Ireland was a pupil of Stanford, and his master's influence shows through here. Ireland's setting of the words is sensitive, and he cleverly shares thematic material between the choir and the organ accompaniment, giving a sense of wholeness and integrity.

Aside from this Service, John Ireland's lasting contributions to church music are the splendid motet "Greater Love hath no man" and the hymn tune "Love Unknown".

The communion motet is "I give to you a new commandment", by Peter Nardone (born 1965). Nardone has maintained a dual career as singer and conductor/organist. He has sung with The King's Consort, Monteverdi Choir, The Gabrieli Consort, and The Tallis Scholars. He was Director of Music at Chelmsford Cathedral, and from 2012-2018 was Organist and Director of Music at Worcester Cathedral, and Artistic Director of the famous Three Choirs Festival. His compositions are published by Boosey & Hawkes and the RSCM.

This piece combines the plainsong 'Ubi Caritas', sung by the tenors and basses, with a gently expressive melody in the sopranos and altos.
