Welcome to Christ Church on this Third Sunday in Lent and a special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the service.

As we journey through Lent, I am reminded that part of the Lenten discipline is an invitation to develop new habits that take us away from sin and instead invite us toward life. When I coached rowing, one of the things I was often aware of was that it took repeating an action in a situation over a thousand times to form a new habit. However, what is more difficult is changing an old habit into a new one; it takes over ten thousand times to make that change.

This Lenten journey that we take is about developing virtues in ourselves and seeing our character develop further. Now the word 'virtue' in our world tends to vaguely mean goodness or behaving yourself. Virtue though comes from a Latin word that basically means 'strength'. And the idea in the classical tradition is that character can be built up just as muscles can be trained if you're going to be a cricketer or a weightlifter.

These virtues though are not about making ourselves more holy, Jesus gives us his holiness through his life, death and resurrection. These virtues are about developing and growing into what God has gifted us with, the ability to reflect the very image of God into the world.

And so as we gather today, to pray, to repeat again familiar actions and words, it is about growing into what God has made us to be in Christ Jesus. I hope as we worship today you might become more aware of God's invitation to you.

The Epistle is written in the fifth chapter of the Apostle Paul's Epistle to the Ephesians, beginning at the first verse.

HEREFORE be imitators of God as dear children. And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma. But fornication and all uncleanness or covetousness, let it not even be named among you, as is fitting for saints; neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks. For this you know, that no fornicator, unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. Therefore do not be partakers with them. For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light (for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth), finding out what is acceptable to the Lord. And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them. For it is shameful even to speak of those things which are done by them in secret. But all things that are exposed are made manifest by the light, for whatever makes manifest is light. Therefore He says: "Awake, you who sleep, Arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light."
