As we continue on through this season of Easter it is worth reflecting on what it means to be human as we look at the Risen Jesus. Bishop Tom Wright says about Easter Humanity.

Easter humanity, in fact, is genuine humanity, as opposed to humanity distorted and defaced by sin, decay and death. One of the great lies of our time is that abstaining from sin means failure to live a fully human life. Resurrection power comes to us, as it were, from our future, so that we can anticipate the truly human life in the here and now.

So, our call is not to live out of our past but out of our future. This is an important part to reflect on as individuals as to the resurrection and the love we have in Christ Jesus. It is also worth reflecting on as a church, that in that Easter hope we move forward towards what God is calling us to be - more truly who we were originally made to be, fully living the life of those called to worship him.

But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God. For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: "Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth"; who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously; who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed. For you were like sheep going astray, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.



The Holy Gospel is written in the twenty-fourth chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Luke beginning at the thirty-sixth verse.

# Glory be to thee, O Lord.

OW as they said these things, Jesus Himself stood in the midst of them, and said to them, "Peace to you." But they were terrified and frightened, and supposed they had seen a spirit. And He said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do doubts arise in your hearts? Behold My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself. Handle Me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see I have." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His feet. But while they still did not believe for joy, and marvelled, He said to them, "Have you any food here?" So they gave Him a piece of a broiled fish and some honeycomb. And He took it and ate in their presence. Then He said to them, "These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me." And He opened their understanding, that they might comprehend the Scriptures. Then He said to them, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. And you are witnesses of these things."

HEAR us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood: who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, TAKE, EAT, THIS IS MY BODY WHICH IS GIVEN FOR YOU: DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.


