

The Blessing of the New Fire, and the First Eucharist of Easter 7:00pm
Saturday 3 April 2021

The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church for Holy Saturday and our Easter Vigil, a special welcome to any visitors with us today.

Because this liturgy is celebrated only once a year, and because it is unlike any other, The Great Vigil consists of

four parts: the Service of Light; the Ministry of the Word; the renewal of Baptismal promises; and the celebration of the Easter Eucharist.

The Service of Light begins outside the building. The fire is kindled, the Paschal candle lit and carried into the darkened building, the peoples' candles are lit and the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) sung. The Paschal candle is new every year, it is a symbol of the resurrection and so reminds us of it for the whole year.

We follow the Paschal candle into the church and light our own candles from it. Each of our own candles represents our own discipleship, our own witnessing to the Resurrection of Jesus. It for this reason also that we renew our baptismal vows, we again place our trust in Christ and turn to him.

As we praise God this evening we again turn to Jesus, as our saviour, and we celebrate his victory over the grave. It is not just his victory as it becomes ours as well.

Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

May you celebrate Jesus' victory for us this Easter, knowing that we are his prize as the Church.

The Priest, Sanctuary Party and People gather together in the forecourt of the church, where the new fire is lighted.

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Let us pray



GOD, who through thy Son, who is the true cornerstone, hast bestowed upon thy faithful people the fire of thy brightness: we beseech thee that thou wouldest sanct⊮ify this new fire, now struck by us from the

flintstone, to be profitable to our service: and grant unto us that by this paschal feast we may be so inflamed with heavenly desires, that we may with pure hearts and minds attain unto the feast of thy eternal brightness.

Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Blessing of the Paschal Candle

The paschal candle is brought into the midst before the Priest. The Priest says:



HRIST yesterday and today, the Beginning and the End, Alpha and Omega; His are all times, and all ages, to him be glory and dominion, through all the ages of eternity. Amen.

BY his holy and glorious wounds, Christ our Lord guard us and preserve us.

Amen.

The Priest lights the paschal candle, saying:



HE Light of Christ, who riseth gloriously, drive out all darkness from each heart and mind.

The Priest then blesses the lighted paschal candle, saying:

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Let us pray.

E beseech thee, almighty God, to pour down on this lighted candle the abundance of thy bless ing: and as thou, thyself unseen, art the regenerator of all mankind, so now we pray thee kindle a light to lighten our darkness; that both our sacrifice to be offered on this night may be made bright by the inward presence of thy holy light, and that all places wheresoever light shall be brought from this mystery here sanctified by us, may by the same be relieved from the crafts and assaults of the devil, and filled with the mighty power of thy heavenly majesty. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The candles held by Servers and members of the congregation are then lighted.

The Solemn Procession and the Paschal Proclamation

The Priest, Sanctuary Party and People then process, in that order, into the church, which is in darkness. When the Deacon has entered the church, he raises the blessed paschal candle upright, and sings:

The light of Christ.

Thanks be to God.

This versicle and response is then repeated twice more in the course of the procession: once in the middle of the church, and at the chancel step:

The light of Christ.

Thanks be to God.

When the Priest and Sanctuary Party arrive in the chancel, the paschal candle is placed on a stand in their midst.

The beginning of the Paschal Proclamation is then sung by the Deacon beside the paschal candle.



EJOICE now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout Salvation for the great victory of our mighty King.

Rejoice and sing now, all the round earth, bright with a glorious splendour, for darkness has been vanquished by our eternal King. Rejoice and be glad now, Mother Church, and let your holy courts in radiant light resound with the praises of your people. The Deacon continues:

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give him thanks and praise.



T is truly right and good, always and everywhere, with our whole heart and mind and voice, to praise you, the invisible, almighty, and eternal God, and your only begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: for He is the true Paschal Lamb, who at the feast of the Passover paid for us the debt of sin,

and by his blood delivered your faithful people.

This is the night, when you brought our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt, and led them through the Red Sea on dry land. This is the night, when all who believe in Christ are delivered from the gloom of sin, and are restored to grace and holiness of life. This is the night when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave.

How wonderful and beyond our knowing, O God, is your mercy and lovingkindness to us, that to redeem a slave, you gave your Son. How holy is this night, when wickedness is put to flight, and sin is washed away. It restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to those who mourn. It casts out pride and hatred, and brings peace and concord. How blessed is this night, when earth and heaven are joined, and man is reconciled to God!

Holy Father, accept our celebration, and the offering of this candle in your

honour. May it shine continually to drive away all darkness. May Christ the Morning Star who knows no setting, find it ever burning - He who gives his light to all creation, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Christ is risen. Alleluia!

The lights are switched on, and the candles extinguished during the Organ Fanfare.

Then shall the people stand as the Choir sings the Gloria.

but made alive by the Spirit, by whom also He went and preached to the spirits in prison, who formerly were disobedient, when once the Divine longsuffering waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight souls, were saved through water. There is also an antitype which now saves us—baptism (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, angels and authorities and powers having been made subject to Him.

The Sermon

Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows

The Priest and the Sanctuary Party move to the Font The Priest, standing, says:

S we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism, so that we may rise

with him to a new life within the family of his Church. Now that we have completed our observance of Lent, we renew the promises made at our baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ, and our rejection of all that is evil.

Therefore I ask these questions:

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins? I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil?

I renounce evil.

And now I ask you to make the profession of Christian faith into which you were baptized, and in which you live and grow.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, who made the world?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ, who redeemed mankind?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith: We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Amen.

lmighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all those who have been baptized in your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Then shall the people stand to sing the Hymn for the Offertory:

The Priest will Sprinkle the congregation with water to remind them of their baptisms, while the Sanctuary party returns to the Chancel.






