

#### The Rector Writes



Good morning and welcome to Christ Church. Christ is risen! Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the service. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

Thank you for all who were involved in last week's Easter Vestry meeting, and the elections of new office holders for the Parish for the next year. Our Gospel this morning reminds us of the importance of love to Jesus, that it was love that motivated him to allow himself to go to the cross. It is a significant theme in all of John's writings both in the Gospel and also in his epistles.

When reflecting on love I am so often drawn to the Hymn "My song is love unknown" the opening verse.

My song is love unknown, My Savior's love to me; Love to the loveless shown, That they might lovely be. O who am I, That for my sake My Lord should take Frail flesh, and die?

Who am I that God would love me like he did through the person of Jesus? It leads me to surrender myself to him each time that I reflect on God's love. May you also deeply reflect on what love meant to Jesus.

If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless. Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world.


#### **BIRTHDAY SUNDAY**
