

#### The Rector Writes

Welcome to Christ Church, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

Last Sunday's service for the Celebration of the Queen's Birthday was a wonderful celebration, and wonderful to be able to have had such a crowd in a 'Covid world'. The challenges of making such an event work with protocols, Covid restrictions and other complications, should not be overestimated, and it was wonderful to have an event where hopefully we were not needing to be aware of those challenges. Our thanks to all involved for their special efforts: the organist, the choir, the sanctuary party, the wardens, the sidesmen and attendants, the office staff, the caterer, and to all who participated with heart and voice.

In baptism we are visibly signed by water as baptised in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. A much deeper thing though is being proclaimed to us, the inward and spiritual grace, namely that we are dead to sin, that we have a new birth unto righteousness. It means that we are declared children of grace by God because of what Jesus has done for us.

It is these simple words that we are asked to learn off by heart in the Catechism that speak to us of the depth of our faith. And so it is by great privilege today to be baptising Ava Gilbert, a sister of us in Christ Jesus. And so we welcome her along with her parents and her godparents as they promise with her and on her behalf to follow Christ.

Can I remind you all to make sure that you are remaining Covid-safe and signing in either with the 'app' or on the sheets provided here at Christ Church or when visiting places around South Australia. Do not be surprised if I or one of other Covid Marshall asks you to show them the 'green tick' on your device. We do not wish you to be fined for not signing in, nor do we wish the Parish to be fined for not ensuring that everyone who is on the premises has signed in.


The Epistle is written in the fifth Chapter of the Apostle Peter's first Epistle beginning at the fifth verse.

to grant all these things that you have prayed for; which promise he, for his part, will most surely keep and perform. You, on your part, must undertake three things:

FIRST, that you will declare allegiance to Christ: Secondly, that you will repent of your sins, and thirdly that you will renounce the devil and all his works.

Then, speaking to the Godparents severally, he shall say

Ava has been brought for baptism, let us now profess the faith into which she is to be baptised and in which she is to be brought up.

I believe in the Holy Ghost: the holy Catholick Church; the Communion of Saints; the Forgiveness of sins; the Resurrection of the body, 

■ and the Life everlasting. Amen.

Do you profess the Christian Faith?

After which the Priest, the Parents and Godparents shall proceed to the font, then shall the Priest say



WHEREFORE, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

MOST humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

AND here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and lively sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee, that all we, who are partakers of this holy Communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

AND although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences.
