Welcome to Christ Church, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

It continues to be difficult under the current restrictions to do a lot of things that we would consider normal to do

at church. Masks continue to be required at church as it is an indoor public place, with all the normal exceptions for medical reasons.

Please join us for morning tea this morning after either morning service. At morning tea you are required to wear a mask in the hall except when seated to consume your food and drink. Please be mindful of this, and out of courtesy to others do not move about the hall without a mask on.

All the normal precautions we're already taking apply: we'll still have checkin, exercise social distancing (1.5m) particularly between groups, and if you're feeling unwell, please stay home and get tested. The Archbishop has asked that we continue to encourage those who can to get vaccinated.

There has been a purchase of Singers' Masks for the choir. The Sanctuary guild have covered the costs for these but if you would like to also contribute, please speak to myself or the wardens. We welcome back our choir today. If you wish to join in the singing, best practice as advised by Churches Together SA is:

"If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask."

I also wanted to draw people's attention to the best practise when receiving communion. When coming to Holy Communion leave your mask on. The bread will be placed into your hands with the words of administration and you then walk to the side. You can lift up the bottom of your mask and take

communion away from others. This prevents us breathing on others while lining up to receive and also prevents breathing on the priest.

I would like to thank everyone who was involved in last weekend's parish conference, and look forward to sharing with you the report from the day in the next couple of weeks.

Our Collect this week mentions faith, hope and charity/love. These concepts have a certain correspondence to past, present and future. In large part Faith looks back to the revelation of God in word and in deed, and especially in the Incarnate Son, recorded in Holy Scripture and witnessed by tradition. But faith propels us into the future for it is the substance of things hoped for the things God has promised in, through and with Christ. So, faith is joined to Hope in and by which we truly look forward in humble confidence to the fulfilment of God's purposes and will for us and for the universe. But we do not live merely in memories of the past and anticipations of the future; there is Love. We are to love our neighbour as ourselves, to love one another as Christ loves us, and to fulfil all the commands of the law by loving God and others.

As Christians in the world right now, it is so important that we are showing love. During this pandemic there is abundance of mental health issues occurring for people. Let alone the continual impact of the withdrawal from Afghanistan and the impact that has on those who have served in that conflict and their families. We are called to be people of Faith and Hope so that we might be people of love today. It is our Faith, Hope and Love that will make a real difference not only in our own lives but in the lives of those we interact with.

Then they brought to Him one who was deaf and had an impediment in his speech, and they begged Him to put His hand on him. And He took him aside from the multitude, and put His fingers in his ears, and He spat and touched his tongue. Then, looking up to heaven, He sighed, and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." Immediately his ears were opened, and the impediment of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke plainly. Then He commanded them that they should tell no one; but the more He commanded them, the more widely they proclaimed it. And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He makes both the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."

 Dutton; the Assistant Minister for Defence, the HON Andrew Hastie; and
