The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance..

The theme of this Sunday from our Collect is pardon and peace. We pray for pardon, that we may be cleansed from all our sin; and for peace, that we may serve God with quiet minds.

This morning's Epistle encourages us to "put on" the whole armour of God in our Christian life. We pray so earnestly for pardon and peace in the Collect because the Christian is engaged in a life-long conflict with the forces of evil and wickedness. Our only hope is to lay hold of the armour of God which he so graciously offers us, taking the shield of faith, trusting that we have "pardon" (the helmet of salvation), and that our feet are "shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace." Note how St. Paul himself shows the power of pardon to give peace in that, although he writes this letter from prison, its tone is bold and cheerful.

It is with this confidence that Jesus has won us our Salvation, that we are able to approach the challenges and successes of our lives. This is perhaps the most significant gift the Gospel gives to Christians with the knowledge of Salvation we enter the chaos and uncertainty of this life with order and certainty that cannot be taken from us. As the world continues now nearly to the end of the second year of a pandemic and with still so much uncertainty in the world. As Christians we are able to continue to love and care for those around us with the certainty that God has us in his care.

I pray that you have this confidence in the Gospel today.

COVID ETIQUETTE

It continues to be difficult under the current restrictions to do a lot of things that we would consider normal to do at church. Masks continue to be required at church as it is an indoor public place, with all the normal exceptions for medical reasons.

All the normal precautions we're already taking apply: we'll still have check-in, exercise social distancing (1.5m) particularly between groups, and if you're feeling unwell, please stay home and get tested. The Archbishop has asked that we continue to encourage those who can to get vaccinated. If you wish to join in the singing, best practice as advised by Churches Together SA is:

" If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask."

The best practise when coming to receive communion is to leave your mask on. The bread will be placed into your hands with the words of administration. You may then walk to the side and lift up the bottom of your mask and take communion at a distance from others. This prevents us breathing on others while lining up to receive communion, and also prevents breathing on the priest.

COLLECTION GIVING

Due to COVID-19 regulations, the normal routine of circulating collection bags is not undertaken. Instead, a collection bowl is located adjacent to the centre aisle at the rear of the church.

HEARING AID USERS

This church is fitted with a hearing aid loop (Tele coil system). If your hearing aid is fitted with a Tele coil system you may wish to try this feature.

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armour of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints- and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak.


