The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

As we pray today's Collect we ask that God may keep his Church in continual godliness so that it may be free from all adversities, and able to serve him in good works. In scripture as in in this Collect we see the Church as the Household of God under his guidance and care. We become part of the Household through our baptism. It is not its members which make the Church holy, but Christ who loved the Church and gave himself for it, purifying it by the washing of water in Holy Baptism. The true Church is glorious and will be presented to him when he returns, perfect without spot or stain. As members of his Church, we are called to become holy in our lives by the power of the Holy Spirit.

It is this difference from the Church that is made Holy by Christ and those who are simply part of the institution of the church who are not turning their hearts to Christ. It is for this reason we ask God to protect us from our adversaries, really those both outside and inside the institutional church. The Church is faced with opposition and persecution from without and from within its family. Not only is the Church attacked from an unbelieving world without, but it is also constantly assailed by those within who do not believe in the truth of the Gospel. We seek God's protection, for without his presence we have no power in ourselves to help ourselves. We must be "devoutly given to serve thee in good works, to the glory of thy Name." This is not a desperate pray for survival, it is a prayer remembering that as Christians, as the Church, we exist for the glory of God and we show this both by what we say and what we do. This is what St. Paul prays in today's Epistle that the Philippians may be "filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ unto the glory and praise of God."

As we pray this Collect we pray that we bring God praises and that we may continue to do so both in word and deed. This is both as individuals but also together as the Church.

COVID ET IQUETTE

It continues to be difficult under the current restrictions to do a lot of things that we would consider normal to do at church. Masks continue to be required at church as it is an indoor public place, with all the normal exceptions for medical reasons.

All the normal precautions we're already taking apply: we'll still have check-in, exercise social distancing (1.5m) particularly between groups, and if you're feeling unwell, please stay home and get tested. The Archbishop has asked that we continue to encourage those who can to get vaccinated. If you wish to join in the singing, best practice as advised by Churches Together SA is:

"If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask."

The best practise when coming to receive communion is to leave your mask on. The bread will be placed into your hands with the words of administration. You may then walk to the side and lift up the bottom of your mask and take communion at a distance from others. This prevents us breathing on others while lining up to receive communion, and also prevents breathing on the priest.

COLLECTION GIVING

Due to COVID-19 regulations, the normal routine of circulating collection bags is not undertaken. Instead, a collection bowl is located adjacent to the centre aisle at the rear of the church.

do not regard the person of men, but teach the way of God in truth. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not? Shall we pay, or shall we not pay?" But He, knowing their hypocrisy, said to them, "Why do you test Me? Bring Me a denarius that I may see it." So they brought it. And He said to them, "Whose image and inscription is this?" They said to Him, "Caesar's." And Jesus answered and said to them, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." And they marvelled at Him.

Then one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together,

perceiving that He had answered them well, asked Him, "Which is the first commandment of all?" Jesus answered him, "The first of all the commandments is: 'Hear, O Israel, the LORD our God, the LORD is one. And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." So the scribe said to Him, "Well said, Teacher. And to love Him with all the heart, with all the understanding, with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbour as oneself, is more than all the whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." Now when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, He said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." But after that no one dared question Him.
