The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your

acquaintance.

As today is the Sunday closest to Remembrance Day, we will have an act of Remembrance at the end of both our morning services. You can see as you walk around our buildings the impact that the Wars had on our community and the significant number of people who heard the call to defend our way of life. It is important, particularly as Christians, not to glory in war. Too many occasions turn in to celebrations about war, rather than considering the loss and learning the lessons that caused such bloodshed. In particular this year, it is important that we are praying for and supporting those who served in Afghanistan and their families. With the conclusion of the operations in that country we must not dimmish the cost to those who serve our country. And so we remember all who have responded to that call throughout the ages today, and we especially remember those who did not return.

On 11 November 1918, marked the end of the first World War by the guns of the Western Front falling silent after four years of continuous warfare.

From June of 1918, the five divisions of the Australian Corps had been one of the leading forces in the advance to victory.

At the rural town of La Hamel in the early summer, they helped to turn the tide of the war at Amiens in August, followed by the capture of Mont St Quentin and Pèronne, and the breaching of German defences at the Hindenburg Line in September.

The exhausted Australian divisions were withdrawn from battle.

By late October early November discussions of an armistices were on the lips of leadership and by the 11th hour of the 11th day of November 1918, and Armistice was signed and remembrance day was instigated.

The Australian's suffered almost 48,000 casualties during 1918, including more than 12,000 dead.

Across the period of 1914-1918 more than 330,000 Australians had served overseas, and more than 60,000 of them had died.

The effects of the war permeated thinking and wove itself into the fabric of Australian society.

We mark Remembrance day as reminder to the conclusion of the war that was suppose to 'end all wars'.

We remember ANZAC day specifically to the Australian's and New Zealanders went into the battle the first time and also represent those who have served in further conflicts.

COVID ETIQUETTE

It continues to be difficult under the current restrictions to do a lot of things that we would consider normal to do at church. Masks continue to be required at church as it is an indoor public place, with all the normal exceptions for medical reasons.

All the normal precautions we're already taking apply: we'll still have check-in, exercise social distancing (1.5m) particularly between groups, and if you're feeling unwell, please stay home and get tested. The Archbishop has asked that we continue to encourage those who can to get vaccinated. If you wish to join in the singing, best practice as advised by Churches Together SA is:

"If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask."

The best practise when coming to receive communion is to leave your mask on. The bread will be placed into your hands with the words of administration. You may then walk to the side and lift up the bottom of your mask and take communion at a distance from others. This prevents us breathing on others while lining up to receive communion, and also prevents breathing on the priest.







thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.




