The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

This Sunday we continue through Advent each of the Collects which, during the season bring us to the important parts of the Christian faith, being the start of the Christian year. Today our Collect thanks God for the Scriptures that point us to God's Word, to Jesus. That we may hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them. That in doing all of that with the Bible that we may then embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, that God has given us in Jesus.

The Collect reminds us that if you want to know God, or even to know about God, you need to look at Jesus and what was said about him. We observe what was said about Jesus by those who went before him, those who were with him and those afterwards who reflected on following him as the early church. We get all of that in the Bible, so we look at the Bible to get to know Jesus.

Thank you to the Adelaide Cantata Band who put on an amazing concert on Friday night. We look forward to seeing them join us at Evensong tonight, and warmly welcome members of the parish and beyond to be part of the evening.

If you have not yet done the National Church Life Survey can I please ask you to do so. You can either make note of the way to do the survey online or take a paper copy of the survey, which are available at the back of the church. Please return it to the office before the 19th of December. The National Church Life Survey is an important part of reflecting on the parish and planning for the future together.

With the borders open please make sure you are aware of all Covid recommendations for attending today's gatherings of Church.

Lastly, I would like to let you know that in January I will be running the Resolve course, both for people in the Parish and for those beyond. Resolve is a four-week course that aims to connect with those who visit our church over the Christmas period and then go on to make New Year resolutions. Over four weeks, delegates explore how to look after their bodies, strengthen their minds, inspire their souls and deepen their relationships. Our hope is that in running Resolve, a space will be created to enable conversations to flourish, life skills to be developed, relationships to be formed and for people to deepen their spiritual experiences. Please be praying for this and thinking of those you might be able to invite.

COVID ETIQUETTE

It continues to be difficult under the current restrictions to do a lot of things that we would consider normal to do at church. Masks continue to be required at church as it is an indoor public place, with all the normal exceptions for medical reasons. All the normal precautions we're already taking apply: we'll still have check-in, exercise social distancing (1.5m) particularly between groups, and if you're feeling unwell, please stay home and get tested. The Archbishop has asked that we continue to encourage those who can to get vaccinated. If you wish to join in the singing, best practice as advised by Churches Together SA is:

" If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask."

The best practise when coming to receive communion is to leave your mask on. The bread will be placed into your hands with the words of administration. You may then walk to the side and lift up the bottom of your mask and take communion at a distance from others. This prevents us breathing on others while lining up to receive communion, and also prevents breathing on the priest.

There are new guidelines as to quarantine and testing requirements when you are a contact with a Covid case. These have been printed and placed on the noticeboard on the entrances to the Church.

COLLECTION GIVING

Due to COVID-19 regulations, the normal routine of circulating collection bags is not undertaken. Instead, a collection bowl is located adjacent to the centre aisle at the rear of the church. Or you can make a direct deposit BSB number 105 096 Account number 074508840.







Information Update

We have some further information on COVID-19 restrictions around singing and communion.

Singing

Since SA Health issued their document "Assessing and managing the risk: COVID exposures in general businesses and venues" we have had a number of queries about the statement in Table 1 regarding singing as an aerosol behaviour and the impact of that on the assessment of category of contact (Low Risk, Casual, Vaccinated Close contact etc)

SA Health have today advised us: "Singing can still occur with services: If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask.

If the congregation has the ability to follow the recommendations in the above statement this information would then be utilised by those undertaking contact tracing. The appropriate use of masks has the potential to alter the risk level associated with events including services should a COVID positive be identified that has attended."
