The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church, on this the Third Sunday after Epiphany, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

It is a great joy to be able to welcome back the choir today and recommence singing in the Parish after having a break since Christmas.

I would like to draw your attention to the 'Being a Seatholder' brochure at the back of the church which details about Seatholding and Pew rent at Christ Church. It gives some history and explains its purpose for our parish.

I would also like to tell you about the Epiphany house blessings or 'Chalking of the Doors' and to mention that if you would like to have your home blessed in this manner to make contact with myself or to let the office know and I can make a time to visit.

On Sunday the 6th of February, Grant Reubenicht, the CEO of AnglicareSA will be joining us for worship at the 10am Service. After the 10am Service Grant will be giving a presentation on *Turning Point* - the AnglicareSA project that the parish supported during 2021. May I ask you to make an effort to come and hear Grant share on this important work.

The 6th of February is also the 70th Anniversary of the Accession to the Throne of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. In 2022, The Queen will become the first Monarch of the United Kingdom to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee marking seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 when she was 25 years old. We will pray for her in our services as we do each time we gather.

Our Collect today, acknowledges our frailty, and it acknowledges that we cannot always stand upright in front of God. Now in part we would take this as meaning that we are weighed down in sin and should not stand upright before God. It also means that we are too busy inwardly looking at ourselves and our own sin to be looking to God for Salvation. As human beings we need God's strength and protection so we can stand upright, both so we can see what God has done for us, but also to see the needs of those around us. As Christians, because of Jesus we stand upright to face the dangers of our world.

COVID ETIQUETTE

It continues to be difficult under the current restrictions to do a lot of things that we would consider normal to do at church. Masks continue to be required at church as it is an indoor public place, with all the normal exceptions for medical reasons.

All the normal precautions we're already taking apply: we'll still have check-in, exercise social distancing (1.5m) particularly between groups, and if you're feeling unwell, please stay home and get tested. The Archbishop has asked that we continue to encourage those who can to get vaccinated. If you wish to join in the singing, best practice as advised by Churches Together SA is:

" If singing is essential to your practice of worship or faith based service, this is permitted, but masks must be worn at all times. To ensure masks remain effective and protect you, you should change your mask as soon as it becomes damp and also after you have finished singing. Make sure you bring spare masks, a bag to keep used masks in, and hand sanitiser to use before and after putting on or taking off a mask."

The best practise when coming to receive communion is to leave your mask on. The bread will be placed into your hands with the words of administration. You may then walk to the side and lift up the bottom of your mask and take communion at a distance from others. This prevents us breathing on others while lining up to receive communion, and also prevents breathing on the priest.



A NOTE FROM THE ARCHBISHOP

In a recent letter to the Clergy the archbishop wrote:


