

Welcome to Christ Church, on this the Fifth Sunday after Epiphany, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself

known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

A Special welcome this morning at the 10am service to Grant Reubenicht, the CEO of AnglicareSA. After the 10am Service Grant will be giving a presentation on Turning Point, the AnglicareSA project that the parish supported during 2021.
