# The Rector Writes



Welcome to Christ Church, on this third Sunday of Lent, a very special welcome to any visitors with us today. Please join us for morning tea in the parish hall following the morning services. If you are a visitor, please make yourself known to me at the door. It will be lovely to make your acquaintance.

As we journey through Lent, I am reminded that part of the Lenten discipline is an invitation to develop new habits, that take us away from sin and instead invite us towards life. When I coached rowing, one of the things I was often aware of was that it took repeating an action in a situation over a thousand times to form a new habit. However, what is more difficult is changing an old habit into a new one, it takes over ten thousand times to make that change.

This Lenten journey that we take is about developing virtues in ourselves and seeing our character develop further. Now the word 'virtue' in our world tends to vaguely mean goodness or behaving yourself. Virtue though comes from a Latin word that basically means 'strength'. And the idea in the classical tradition is that character can be built up just as muscles can be trained if you're going to be a cricketer or a weightlifter.

These virtues though are not about making ourselves more holy, Jesus gives us his holiness through his life, death and resurrection. These virtues are about developing and growing into what God has gifted us with, the ability to reflect the very image of God into the world.

And so as we gather today, to pray, to repeat again familiar actions and words it is about growing into what God has made us to be in Christ Jesus. I hope as we worship today you might become more aware of God's invitation to you.

Due to Covid impacts on the Rectory family, it has been decided to wait till the second term to start the Sunday School. We are still looking for additional volunteers if this is something that you can help with please let myself or Deborah know.

The Lenten Studies will recommence this week having been interrupted by my quarantine. I would like to thank you all for your prayers and support of myself and my family while we were out of action with Covid-19. We are very thankful that it was picked up when it was and that we did not put other members of the parish at risk with the virus. Please continue to pray for all those who are impacted not only by the virus but also the other costs caused by isolation.

# **COVID ETIQUETTE**




